
# What evaluations are we currently involved in?


- 1. Multi-region evaluation of the national roll out of social prescribing link workers in primary care
  - Funded by the NIHR; March 2022 to February 2025
  - Led by Paul Wilson
  - Involves members of ICP and GMCA as co-Is
  - Specific focus on 'link worker model'
- Organisations of Hope: Building a Creative Consortium for Health Equity in Greater Manchester
  - Funded by UKRI (led by AHRC); November 2022 to July 2023
  - Led by Simon Parry (University of Manchester)
  - Involves members of ICP and GMCA as co-Is
  - Specific focus on 'creative health'
  - Phase 3 call is now open...

## 2. Organisations of Hope

#### **Our aims**

- 1. Build a transdisciplinary consortium that includes expertise across sectors
- 2. Explore a range of models for the integration of creative health approaches across GM
- 3. Prepare to establish community asset hubs in two GM priority areas children and young people and adult brain health
- 4. Map community assets across the city region, localities and neighbourhoods to identify those creative and cultural interventions, programmes and activities with the potential to mitigate specific wider determinants of health
- 5. Build a GM Creative Health Learning Hub, to disseminate knowledge and evidence on creative health practice and to offer training and professional development
- 6. An agenda for future research and learning



## Developing a wider evaluation of Live Well

- Develop and refine separate Evaluation and Research Strategies aligned to Live Well
- Development of a logic model/theory of change linking Live Well to short, medium, and longterm outcomes and exploring the mechanisms between Live Well and improved health and well-being and more sustainable health and care systems
- Understand research activity that is currently ongoing in GM linked to Live Well and related initiatives
- Establish core metrics (linked to logic model and mechanisms i.e. causal pathway) such that change over time can be assessed and linked back to Live Well
- Identify potential areas to target interventions (and control or comparator areas)
- Used to help shape bid to the National Lottery Community Fund and other future bids
