- Wound management is mostly performed by nurses with the majority of chronic wound care occurring in the community₍₁₎
- Pressure and leg ulcers are the most common wounds found in the community₍₂₎
- Pressure and leg ulcers are painful and negatively impact the lives of people that have them (3.4)
