- · Looking at management of Severe AKI at WWL
- Looking at mortality and morbidity


Results

- Mortality rate higher than any other trust in audit 44.2% compared to 38.3% nationally
- Poorly performing in Medication reviews 59% compared to 85.5%
- Discussing with specialist services 20.5% compared to 35.7%


Going Forward

- 6 monthly MDT study day


#### **EFFECTIVE**

- Early referrals to higher care (Renal/ITU)


#### CARING




## Mortality 1 month after AKI




## **Average Length of Stay**



## **Average AKI Days**




